CHAPTER-I

Short Title and Definitions:

1. The regulations that follow hereafter shall be called "CBCS Examination Regulations of Vikram Deb (Autonomous) College, Jeypore 2015.
2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires.
 - a. 'College' means Vikram Deb (Autonomous) College'.
 - b. 'Principal' means the Principal of the College.
 - c. 'University' means Berhampur University.
 - d. 'Executive Committee' (EC) means the Executive Committee of the College.
 - e. 'Academic Council' (AC) means the Academic Council of the College.
 - f. 'Board of Studies' means the Board of Studies of all teaching Subjects of the College.
 - g. 'Examination Committee' (EXC) means Examination Committee of the College.
 - h. Academic Year' Means the Year Commencing From the 1 day of June of a calendar year to the 31 May of the succeeding calendar year.
 - i. 'Year' means the Academic Year.
 - j. 'Controller of Examinations' means the Controller of Examinations of the College.

CHAPTER-II

REGULATIONS FOR THE MASTER DEGREE OF ARTS, SCIENCE AND COMMERCE EXAMINATION (SEMESTER SYSTEM)

(Two - Year Degree Course under Choice Based Credit System)

(Effective for students admitted to First year of Master Degree course during Academic Session 2016-2017 Onwards)

1. Admission to the Master of Degree Course

Rules:

- 1.1(a) Any student who has passed the Degree Examination of Vikram Deb (Autonomous) College or any other Examination recognized as equivalent by the Academic Council / U.G.C shall be admitted into the course on the basic of the rules laid down by the Vikram Deb (Autonomous) College, Jeypore and Government of Odisha.
- (b) A student shall not be admitted into Master Degree Course in Science unless he/she has passed +3 Science or equivalent qualifying examination in Science.
- 1.2 Admission Policy would be decided by the Academic Council of the College / SAMS, Govt. of Odisha / Dept. of Higher Education, Odisha.
- 1.3 If seats are vacant after the last date of admission as prescribed in 1.2, admission on transfer from other colleges (except local Colleges) to the First year classes may be considered by inviting application from among the intending students. However such admission shall have to be completed before 30th September of that year or seven days before the commencement of 1st Mid-Semester examination, whichever is earlier.
- 1.4 The children of the Government employee, who have joined their office on transfer at Jeypore or its proximate locality (where there is no College with facilities of Master of Degree Course), after the last date of application for Admission, may be admitted to First Year Master of

Degree on transfer from a college located in the previous station of the Govt. employee for that related year, subject to availability of seats in this College with the same subject combination, with the same course structure and the same Examination Pattern as in this College.

- 1.5 A student of the College promoted to second year class shall have to admit himself/herself in the respective class, within four weeks of the reopening of the College following summer vacation or by a date notified by the Principal, by depositing necessary fees. However, further two weeks time may be allowed for admission to such students on payment of late fee as prescribed. If a student fails to admit himself / herself in the stipulated period he/she shall be deemed to have discontinued studies.
- 1.6 No admission on transfer, including children of Government employee on transfer, shall be allowed into the Second year Master of Degree classes.
- 1.7 No student shall ordinarily be admitted into a Post-Graduate Department of the College on expiry of 30 clear days, including Sundays & other holidays following the date of reopening of the College after the Summer Vacation or the date of publication of the results of the Bachelors Degree Examination of the College whichever is later. Provided that in exceptional cases the Executive Body may permit a student fifteen clear days, including Sundays and other holidays, more for admission with the late fee as prescribed.
- 1.8 When the result of a student is declared late by the College, the student shall be allowed 21 clear days time, including Sundays and holidays, for admission from the date of publication of his/her result if seats are available and such student shall have to pay the late fee as prescribed if, the admission is beyond the 30 clear days.
- 1.9 The last day of submission of Application is 15 days after the publication of result of Degree Course of Vikram Deb (Autonomous) College or re-opening of this College which is later.

2. Selection Procedure:

Admission to all classes shall be on merit. ✓

- (i) **First merit list** - Shall be prepared taking in consideration the marks secured by the candidate in the concerned core / honours subject.
- (ii) **Second merit list** – Student who have studied core / honours subject but fail to secure core / honours shall be kept in the second merit list
- (iii) **Third merit list** – Shall be prepared from the applicants having no core / honours subject. In that case a Candidate must obtain a minimum of 24 credits (or appear the discipline with full mark 400 and should obtain 50% of marks) in a particular discipline to be considered for admission in to the concern discipline of P.G course.

3. The Examinations

- 3.1 The two year Master of Degree Course in Arts/ Science/ Commerce shall cover a period of two academic years.
 - (a) Each Academic Year shall comprise two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters.
 - (b) Odd Semester is from July to December (i.e. 1st & 3rd Semester) and the Examination shall be held normally during the months of November to December.
 - (c) Even Semester is from January to June (i.e. 2nd & 4th Semester) and the Examination shall be held normally in the months of April to May.
- 3.2 (i) A Candidate for the Master of Degree in Arts/ Science/ Commerce shall be required to pass in all the papers in each of the following examinations.
 - I First Semester Examination.
 - II Second Semester Examination.
 - III Third Semester Examination.
 - IV Fourth Semester Examination.

- (ii) A Candidate must have to complete his/her Master of Degree within consecutive Four Academic years from the date of first Admission, failing which the candidate has to seek readmission into the First year to pursue the Master of Degree Course.

3.3 (i) There are Four types of papers in which examinations are held

- (a) A paper having theory only (Th.)
- (b) A paper having practical only (Pr.)
- (c) A paper having of project work (Pj.) comprising of project work, presentation and Viva-voce.
- (d) A paper having theory and practical components (Th. + Pr.).

For the paper having theory and practical components, 75% of the full marks in the papers shall be allotted for theory and 25% of the full marks in the paper shall be allotted for practical.

- (ii) Each of the Four Semester Examinations shall include a Mid-Semester Examination and an End-Semester Examination.
- (iii) There shall be only End Semester examinations in practical paper, project papers and practical component of a paper having theory and practical components which will be normally held in Nov./ Dec. for odd semesters and Apr. / May for even semesters.
- (iv) For theory papers and theory component of a paper having theory and practical components there will be two examinations in each semesters in each paper, a Mid Semester examination and an End Semester examination.

Mid Semester examination

- (a) A Mid Semester examination shall be held normally in Sept. / Oct. for odd semesters and Feb. / Mar. for even semesters.
- (b) The full marks for Mid Semester examination shall be 20% of the full marks of the theory paper or 20% of the full marks for theory component of a paper having theory and practical components.
- (c) The duration of Mid Semester examination is one hour for all papers in all semesters.

End Semester examination

- (a) A End Semester examination shall be held normally in Nov./Dec. for odd semesters and Apr./May for even semesters.
- (b) The full marks for End Semester examination shall be 80% of the full marks of the theory paper or 80% of the full marks for theory component of a paper having theory and practical components.
- (c) The duration of the End Semesters is as follows
 - (i) The duration of End- Semester Examination for theory paper carrying full marks 50 or less is 02 hours
The duration for papers carrying full marks more than 50 is 03 hours.
 - (ii) The duration of End-Semester examination for practical paper carrying full marks of 50 or less is 03 hours.
The duration for practical paper carrying full marks more than 50 is 06 hours.
 - (iii) The duration of End Semester examination for a project paper is 06 hours.

✓ 3.4 The students shall do a project work during Fourth Semester as a part of regular course work.

✓ 3.5 The students shall compulsorily deliver one seminar lecture in the four semester from the core subject which will be evaluated.

4. Rules of Admission into the Semester Examinations

4.1 A candidate admitted to Master Degree course shall have to register for each of the four End semester examinations by filling in the prescribed form and paying the requisite fees, provided that:

(a) He/she has completed a regular course of study for not less than a semester pertaining to that semester, in a subject he/she has opted for at the time of admission.

For students admitted on transfer, the combined period of study in the previous college and in this college should not be less than one academic semester.

(b) A student must have 75% attendance or above in each paper to be eligible to appear at a semester examination.

However, up to 15% waiver may be granted by the College Principal at his/her discretion on Health Ground (subject to production of Medical Certificate) or participation in sports, cultural activities, NCC and NSS activities etc., provided he/she has taken prior permission of the Principal for such participation and produces Authentic Certificate of participation from the appropriate authorities.

4.2 A student who has registered for the first End semester Examination shall be allowed to continue in to the second semester and a student who has registered for the second End semester Examination shall be allowed to continue into third semester (second year) and so on up to the sixth semester.

4.3 A student must register for both the End Semester examinations in one Academic year and must appear in at least one End Semester examination in that year to be promoted to the next year, failing which he/she shall be deemed to have discontinued studies for that year.

For a student who discontinues studies in the first year shall seek fresh Admission in to the First year, if he/she wishes to pursue the course.

4.4 (i) A student who has been promoted to the second year and has discontinued his/ her studies thereafter with or without being duly admitted to the 2nd year and then seeks admission into the 2nd year in the immediate subsequent year (i.e. in the 3rd year from the date of first admission) / immediate subsequent second year (i.e. in the 4th year from the date of first Admission) shall be considered for admission, subject to vacancy, provided he/she has not taken CLC from the College. However he/she shall have to pass his/her Master Degree including back papers within four academic years from the date of first Admission vide 2.2 (ii).

5. Rules of Examinations:

5.1(a) (i) A candidate has to appear a Mid Semester and an End Semester Examination for each paper. The marks obtained in the Mid Semester Examination shall be added to the marks of End Semester Examination obtained in that paper to obtain the total mark in the paper. Then the total mark is converted into Letter Grade.

(ii) There shall be no Mid Semester Examination in the Practical / Project papers.

(iii) There shall be no back paper clearance for Mid Semester Examination.

(b) If a candidate remains absent in a paper in the Mid Semester Examination, he/she would be allowed to appear in that paper within 15 days from the date of the first Mid Semester examination / by a date notified by the Examination Section subject to –

(i) Production of authentic certificate showing the reason of absence and

(ii) Deposition of a fee as prescribed by the Examination Section.

failing which, the mark in that Mid Semester paper shall be taken as zero for the purpose of computation of marks in that paper.

- 5.2 For a candidate who represents the College /University in Sports /N.C.C/N.S.S/Cultural activities during a Mid Semester Examination, a special Mid Semester Examination may be conducted in the subjects / papers in which he/she remained absent for such purpose /participation.

However the candidate in aforesaid cases is required to obtain prior permission from the Principal for such participation.

- 5.3 The laboratory notebook of each candidate who opts for a paper, in which there is Practical component, shall be inspected by both the Internal and External Examiners. Each experiment in the note book shall contain the date of experiment, full signature of the student and the initials of the teacher who supervised the experiment.

- 5.4 The question papers in all but language subjects of all the four Semester examinations in Arts/Science/Commerce shall be in English and shall contain questions from the syllabus relevant to the examination.

- 5.5 The questions in any paper/subject shall contain overall choice providing two questions, alternative to each other, from each unit of the paper/subject prescribed in courses of study.

- 5.6 Indiscipline in the Examination Hall, in any form, shall be dealt with under Infringement of Examination Rules of Govt. of Odisha under Article 214 of Odisha University First Statutes, 1990.

- 5.7 There shall not be any revaluation of the answer scripts of Mid Semester and End Semester examinations. However, re-totalling of marks in any paper/s in End Semester examination can be allowed on request of the concerned candidate by applying, along with a fee of Rs. 50.00 per paper, within 15 days from the date of issue of mark sheet by the College.

- 5.8 The rules and norms regarding modes of examination, question paper setting, method of valuation and schedule of examination shall be framed by the Controller and Examination Committee of the College.

6. **Scheme of evaluation under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)**

Under the CBCS, the requirement for awarding a Degree Certificate is prescribed in terms of number of credits to be completed by the students.

Each paper/course, seminar and project work is assigned a specific number of credits and the marks secured by a student are converted into grade points and credit points. The performance of a student in a semester is expressed as Grade Point Average to be termed as

SGPA – Semester Grade Point Average for the Semester

CGPA – Cumulative Grade Point Average, calculated progressively during the course leading to the result

7. **Semester:**

- i) Each Semester will consist of 15-18 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. The odd-semester may be scheduled from July to December and even-semester from January to June.
- ii) For subject with practical, each theory paper shall have 40 hours of teaching and each practical paper shall have 20 hours of work per each semester.
- iii) For subject without practical, each Theory paper shall have 50 hours of teaching and 10 hours of tutorial classes per semester.

8. **Credit:**

A unit by which the course work is measured. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (Lecture / Tutorial) or two hours of practical work / field work. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week.

9. **Course Credit:**

It is the sum total of all the credit allotted to all the papers in a semester.

10. **Letter Grade:**

It is an index of performance of a student in a paper / subject of a said course. Grades are denoted by letters.

11. **Grade Point:**

It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on an average 10-point scale.

The allocation of letter Grade and Grade points corresponding to marks secured is shown in the table below:

12. **Credit Point:**

It is the product of grade point secured in a paper in an examination and number of credits for that paper per week.

13. **Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA):**

It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is ratio of total credit points secured by a student in all papers appeared in a semester and the course credit taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.

14. **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):**

It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student in all the semesters.

The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in all the papers in a semester to the sum of all the credit (course credit) in that semester.

The CGPA is progressively calculated for each semester taking into account the total credit points and total credits secured by the student up to that semester.

Finally, The CGPA is calculated as the ratio of total credit points secured by students in all the semester to the sum of all the course credit in all the semester and the final result is classified as shown in the table below.

N.B. : The grade point obtained in CGPA and SGPA are rounded off at the 2nd decimal place by neglecting (or taking as Zero) the value of the digit in 3rd decimal if it is less than 5 and by taking it as 0.01 if the value is 5 or more.

PROJECT WORK

The objective of the project work is to help the student to develop the ability to apply theoretical and practical tools / techniques to solve real life problems related to industry, research laboratory and institutions .After completion of project work, the student should be able to:

1. Identifying the problem in a system.
2. Review of literature relating to the problem.
3. Evaluation of research problem.
4. Collecting materials and methods.
5. Data collection and analysis.
6. Develop the ability to communicate effectively.

Guide lines:

1. Student shall undertake the project work related to concern subject.
2. Head of the Department must provide the services of a teacher for supervising the project work.
3. Each student has to take up project work individually and one teacher can supervise a maximum of four students at a time.
4. After identification of the topic and Supervisor the students have to prepare a project proposal and submit it before HOD for approval. After careful examination of the support system of the Dept. the HOD will approve the proposal for project work.
5. For Chemistry Department will provide the general chemicals and other equipments that are available, But if a student is interested in a topic in which some other chemicals are required which are not available in the Dept. then he/ she has to bear the cost of these chemicals.
6. After completion of the project the student have to submit three copies of the project report to the HOD for evaluation before the commencement of the End Semester examination for evaluation.

7. The project report should contain the following chapters.

Chapter-1: Introduction; Chapter-2: Review of literature, Chapter-3: Scope of research problem

Chapter-4: Materials and method Chapter-5: Result discussion Chapter-6: Conclusion and suggestion; Chapter-7: Bibliography.

8. Along with the project report the student should submit the approved project proposal and the originality certificate duly signed by the student and the supervisor.

9. Certificate of originality: This is to certify that the project titled----- is an original work of the student and is being submitted in partial fulfillment for the award of M.A/ M.Com/ M.Sc. degree of V. Deb Autonomous College, Jeypore .This report has not been submitted earlier either to this college or any other institution for the fulfillment of the requirements of the courses of study.

Pass criteria:

i) A Candidate, to pass in each paper, has to secure a minimum of 36% of marks or Grade – D

ii) A candidate appearing in a paper, not having practical component, to pass must secure -

- a minimum of 20% of marks in the End-Semester examination and
- a minimum of 36% of marks in End-Semester examination and Mid Semester examination taken together.

iii) A Candidate appearing in a paper, having a practical component, to pass must secure -

15. Repeat Examination (Back Paper Clearance):

(i) A student obtaining Grade – F in a paper shall be considered Fail in that paper and has to clear the paper by appearing as back paper at subsequent corresponding (Odd or Even) Semester Examinations. However he/she has to clear the Master Degree examination within four Academic Years from the date of Admission.

(ii) A candidate who fails in a paper containing theory and practical components but has secured 40% or more in the practical examination, shall retain the marks in that practical examination till he/she completes the course. He/she can only appear the theory part of the paper as back paper.

16. Award of Master Degree:

A Student is deemed to have passed the Master Degree Examination if he/she secures 36% / Grade- D or higher in each of all the papers of the Master Degree Course.

Absence or failure of a student in any paper/s shall render the student concerned ineligible for award of Master Degree.

18. Improvement:

A candidate who desires to improve his/her Grade in one or more core paper/s, is allowed to avail only one chance in the immediate subsequent year by appearing in a papers of his/her choice in the corresponding End-semester examination. However, the Master Degree Course should be completed within 4 Academic years from the date of 1st admission.

There shall be no improvement examination for practical paper or practical component of a paper having theory and practical components.

The chance for improvement cannot be extended beyond the four academic year.

The higher of the two marks i.e the mark secured in a paper before the improvement examination and mark secured in the same paper in the improvement examination shall be retained for computation of result.

19. Interpretation of Regulation:
